

# MISSION HOSPITAL ACUTE CARE TOWER

Mission Viejo, CA



This critical care tower provides the most technologically advanced services in the Orange County region. Includes 28 medical/surgical beds, 40 ICU beds (20 per floor), imaging, nuclear medicine, and new chapel. A pedestrian bridge connects the tower to the original facility. Metal panel cladding and exposed braced structural frame conveys a sense of the state-of-the-art services provided within. Extensive glazing provides abundant natural light, promoting an inspiring healing environment for patients and families, plus an enhanced working atmosphere for the staff. A all-faith chapel and healing garden are predominantly featured at the entrance.
